

LEGISLATIVELY SPEAKING January 12, 2022

As our Conference nears, BPW has a mission to accomplish in the Legislative Arena. Since BPW/Ohio is a grassroots organization, we encourage our members at all levels to participate and provide input into the drafting of our Legislative Platform. This Platform will guide our legislative activities for the coming year.

By February 23rd, 2022 Regional Legislative Chairs should have contact with the local BPW Legislative Chairs, requesting that they look over our current Platform and discuss it with their membership. If there are any requested changes, request that they send them to you by March 23rd, 2022 so that you can get them to me by March 31. And prior to the Legislative Platform meeting on April 23rd, 2022. Pursuant to our Policies and Procedures these suggestions should be submitted no later than 30 days prior to the State Legislative Platform meeting.

Local Presidents please provide time during your January or February meeting for your Legislation Chairs to secure input from your membership for them to send to the Region Legislative Representatives. Only the Regional Legislative Chairs will be voting at the Platform meeting. Being aware of this, please make your thoughts known.

The State Legislative Platform, which is adopted at the April 23rd, 2022 Legislative Platform Meeting must be presented to the Executive Committee. Prior to the Pre-Conference Board meeting for the Board to review and approve it prior to it being voted on by the Conference body.

2021-2022 BPW/OHIO LEGISLATIVE PLATFORM

PREAMBLE:

The Alice Paul Equal Rights Amendment shall stand first, foremost and above all other items which may appear on the Legislative Platform of this Federation until equal rights for women and men become guaranteed in the United States Constitution.

THE ALICE PAUL EQUAL RIGHTS AMENDMENT: Equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any state on account of sex.

CIVIL RIGHTS: Actively work to pass legislation, which will ensure equal rights and remedies for women in all phases of their lives, including support of affirmative action programs; and eliminate all forms of harassment against individuals.

ECONOMIC EQUITY: Actively work to support equal educational opportunities; equal treatment for women in all areas of employment, including adequate retirement benefits, improved programs for women reentering the workforce, and implementation of equal pay for work of comparable worth.

DEPENDENT CARE: Actively work to strengthen and improve enrichment programs, physical facilities, and funding for affordable quality dependent care of all ages.

VICTIM RIGHTS: Actively work to strengthen and enforce legal protection for all individuals who are victims of violent acts including domestic and/or sexual violence; and human trafficking; promote violence prevention programs; support services and facilities for survivors of this violence and the funding thereof; and support legislation, which provides compensatory and punitive damage awards to victims.

HEALTH: Actively work to strengthen and enforce legal protection for full access to all health care services including reproductive choice, funding for research into and protection for women's health care and educational programs concerning women's health issues.

POLICY ITEMS: Actively work for the election of and appointment to policymaking positions those who support the BPW Legislative Platform.

The Equal Rights Amendment Update



Equal Rights Amendment

The House voted on February 13th 2020 to remove the deadline for the ratification of the ERA. The House Joint Resolution 79 passed by a vote of 232-183. This vote came 100 years after women won the right to vote and when the amendment was first introduced.

Congress first approved the E.R.A. in 1972, setting a deadline of 1979 for ratification and then to 1982. But that deadline, too, passed with just 35 states — three short of the required 38. But Nevada voted to ratify the amendment in 2017, followed by Illinois in 2018 and in 2019 Virginia became the 38th state, which prompted the move to eliminate the deadline extension. Ohio ratified the amendment in 1974 making it the 33rd state to ratify.

Recently, Attorneys Generals from the last three states to ratify the ERA—filed a formal appeal with a D.C. Circuit Court of Appeals in May last year attempting to force the U.S. archivist David S. Ferriero to publish the ERA to the Constitution. The suit seeks review of a lower court decision in March 2021 that dismissed the original January 2020 case filed by the AGs.

On January 10th, the ERA Coalition and other equality and women's rights advocacy groups filed an amicus brief offering formal support for the appeal. The amicus brief argues that "Congress lacks authority to impose a timeline for ratification." The U.S. House of Representatives clearly agrees with this assessment: In March of last year, by a vote of 222-204, it passed H.J. Res 17, a bipartisan joint resolution introduced by Rep. Jackie Speier (D-Calif.) to remove an arbitrary timeline for ERA ratification. Senators Ben Cardin (D-Md.) and Lisa Murkowski (R-Alaska) have introduced an identical resolution in the Senate—but it faces a steep climb due to the filibuster, which enforces a 60-vote threshold before any legislation can be called for a vote. When speaking about voting rights, President Biden showed support to change the Senate rules. The filibuster is on the table now.

We are one Senate floor vote away from adding the ERA into the Constitution. The bill does have bipartisan backing in the Senate, where it is sponsored by Senators Lisa Murkowski, Republican of Alaska, and Ben Cardin, Democrat of Maryland. Senator Sherrod Brown is a co-sponsor, but Senator Rob Portman is not. Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell told reporters that he was "personally not a supporter" of the ERA.

The ERA Coalition, which is made up of several women's rights advocacy groups, polling shows that 94% of Americans want the Equal Rights Amendment to be part of the Constitution.

What you can do: Call the Capital Switchboard at 202-224-3121

- 1. Contact Senator Portman and ask him to co-sponsor and vote for removing the deadline for the ratification of the ERA. The companion bill is Senate Joint Resolution is 6.
- 2. Make the ERA a focus for the 2022 mid-term elections and Senator Portman's replacement. Ask candidates if they support the ERA being in the Constitution. Vote for candidates who support the ERA.
